Assuming that Red suits will behave, Weinstein Decided that instead of depending on West holding SK (50% chance). He would let the opponents help him decide where to look for his 12<sup>th</sup> trick.

Under the ♠A, East dropped 4 and on the 3<sup>rd</sup> round of trumps, West discarded ♠9. East who started with singleton ◆J discarded Spade 3 ♠ 2 and ♣4

Now was the point of decision to be made by Declarer.

He discarded clubs on Diamonds and played from Dummy towards his Spade Q. That was his 12<sup>th</sup> trick > 2 Spades + 5 Hearts +5 Diamonds.

In the other room NS stopped in 4 Hearts thus there was a swing of 11 IMPs to SCHWARTZ.

The ultimate winner was > Nickell, Richard Freeman, Bob Hamman, Paul Soloway, Eric Rodwell and Jeff Meckstroth.

The losing finalists were SCHWARTZ (Schwartz, Casen, Levin, S.Weinstien, Rosenberg and Zia
