Competitive bidding expertise definitely separates the men from the boys. See which category you fall into on this hand from a matchpoint game with neither side vulnerable.

You are South, holding

Keeping in mind that one hand doesn't prove anything, withholding strong trump support is usually wrong, as in this case. As the cards lie. 4♠ is cold and 5♥ is down one.

How would the bidding have gone had you leaped to 4♥ directly?

West would surely bid 4♠, and now it would be up to your partner to decide whether to bid 5♥. Had partner known you had club strength, he probably would have opted to defend. Not knowing that, it's not clear what he would have done.

And, yes, your 2♣ response by a passed hand is not forcing, but you know there is going to be more bidding and you wanted to describe your hand a little better before supporting hearts. It normally helps partner to know where your outside strength is when you have trump support.

It's a tough game.
